**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
BETWEEN**

INTRODUCTION

The Youth Resource Centre aims to provide a range of support services and structured programs for young people aged between 16-30 years and their families. The Dharmamurthi Rao Bahadur Calavala Cunnan Chetty's Hindu College wish to enter into MoU with the Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development for establishing Youth Resource Centre. Dharmamurthi Rao Bahadur Calavala Cunnan Chetty's Hindu College (DRBCCC Hindu College), Pattabiram, Chennai – 72 and Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development (RGNIYD), Sriperumbudur, 602 105, hereinafter collectively referred to as "The parties" agree to establish this Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) as framework for cooperative programmes for the development of SC/ST youth in and around the college.

RGNIYD is an apex body for the Youth Empowerment in various spheres like Training, Orientation, Research and Consultation. It is an autonomous organisation under the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports. Since its establishment it is empowering the youth of the nation in various aspects like Health, Career, Gender Sensitization, Local Governance and Youth Development (Personality and Leadership, Employability and Entrepreneurship).

RGNIYD is interested to initiate Youth Resource Development Centre in various states to render resources and services to the youth. It is very much concerned about the development of socially and economically disadvantaged Youth of the country. Through the Youth Resource Centre the SC/ST youth in DRBCCC Hindu College and from

neighbourhood communities will be given an opportunity to express their needs and aspirations, problems and issues at different levels.

Establishing Youth Resource Centre for SC/ST youth will envisage societal obligation and participation in the development activities. In addition, the centre will function as a place for learning and inculcate the spirit of Social Harmony and National Unity. According to the national commission for youth the primary function of District Youth Development centres are;

1. To provide information on career opportunity, up to date information regarding the labour market, potential job opportunities and pathways employment.
2. To establish a comprehensive training and employment support strategy, which insists the youth in obtaining and retaining employment.
3. At the local level, youth career guidance cell should involve local government, expert, non-government expert, voluntary and community based youth and development organisation.
4. The district youth centres are recommended to function as multipurpose youth centres. The multipurpose youth Centres should accommodate the range of youth related activities in a youth friendly and accessible location.
5. The block level youth development centres will be net worked and supported by District Youth Development Centres. The community organization and selected youth clubs should manage these centres. The DYDCs may draw a financial technical activities and programmes it undertakes. These centres should have partnership between the local government, corporate and voluntary organization and youth development organization such as Youth Clubs etc.

A discussion on setting up Youth Resource Centre held on 26th June 2013 in the Director's Chamber, followed by the Consultation meeting on Youth Resource Centre held at office of DRBCCC charities office, Egmore on 29th June 2013, attended by Shri. Michael Vetha Siromony, IAS, Director, RGNIYD, Shri. M.Venkatesaperumal, Honorary Secretary, Shri. M.V.Cunniah Chetty, Managing Trustee, Dr. S. Kalpana Bai, Principal, DBRCCC Hindu College, Dr. N. Rajendra Naidu, Director, Centre for Research & Development, and Dr. S. Lalitha, Training Officer, DSEDY, RGNIYD. It was also discussed in the meeting that SC/ST youth must be given information on various government welfare schemes, skill

development programmes and other services to enhance their personality. At the end of the meeting it was finalised that RGNIYD will be collaborating with DRBCCC Hindu College in setting up Youth Resource Centre at DRBCCC Hindu College campus. Following that the DRBCCC Hindu College, requested Rs.1.5 lakh per annum for one year (April 2013 to March 2014) to establish Youth Resource Centre at ITWWS.

OBJECTIVES OF YOUTH RESOURCE CENTRE

- To develop leadership quality among the young people
- To train in gainful employment
- To setup a hub for young people to access information for their empowerment
- To improve communication & computer skills
- To provide career guidance
- To provide such other services to empower the youth

ROLE OF RGNIYD

The RGNIYD will extend its support to Youth Resource Centres on the following aspects;

1. Funding
2. Resource sharing (training) infrastructure facilities (Venue) and Resource persons
3. Monitoring & Evaluation
4. Convening consultation meetings
5. Helping DRBCCC Hindu College in having consultation with the District Administration

ROLE OF DRBCCC Hindu College

1. Appointment of full time Counsellor Preferably MSW candidates
2. Establishing Resource Centre
3. Resource Mapping
4. Linking between various service providers
5. Institutionalize the YRC with the existing clubs and Youth councils/ Panchayats
6. Conducting supporting outreach programmes of RGNIYD
7. Facilitating the community and CBOs for managing and sustaining, networking and linkages
8. Conducting Social Audit for the evaluation of the project at the end of the year
9. Coordinating, lobbying and advocacy
10. Conducting activities based on the objectives
11. Documentation and evaluation
12. Feed back

STRATEGIES

1. Creating Data Base of Young People and Resource availability
2. Establishing Youth Resource Centre
3. Forming Federation and successful entrepreneurs.
4. Develop information Hub for accessing information
5. Providing Career Guidance, Capacity Building training, support services to fulfil the needs and aspirations of young people and inculcating essential skills for them.

APPROACHES

1. To provide the skills / knowledge and education for young people to lead healthy life.
2. To empower young people with access to the support networking, association and Institution for training and employment

EXPECTED OUTCOME

1. Youth Data base
2. Better utilisation of Information Hub
3. Networking with supportive services
4. Empowering SC/ST youth studying in DRBCCC College and from neighbourhood communities
5. SC/ST youth must have been trained on employability skills and Career guidance
6. The YRC at DRBCCC Hindu College would function as a model.

MONITORING MECHANISM

The Dharmamurthi Rao Bahadur Calavala Cunnan Chetty's Hindu College (DRBCCC Hindu College) shall submit quarterly report to RGNIYD and faculty members/Training Officer, Department of Socially Economically Disadvantaged Youth (DSEDY), RGNIYD will physically visit to the YRC during their visit to the project states during training programmes.

The Dharmamurthi Rao Bahadur Calavala Cunnan Chetty's Hindu College (DRBCCC Hindu College) first shall make a review of the progress of YRC combined with RGNIYD and give a presentation at RGNIYD before the release of 2nd Instalment.

Dr. S. Kalpana Bai, Principal, DBRCCC Hindu College submitted the proposal for opening one Youth Resource Centre (for SC/ST Youth) to the Director on 26.06.2013 and it was discussed in the meeting held at office of DRBCCC charities office, Egmore on 29th June 2013 in the presence of Director, RGNIYD and was approved by the Director, followed by

the discussion the date of signing MoU was fixed. The details of the revised budget proposal are as follows.

The youth resource centre will be established in DBRCC Hindu College campus. The total cost will be 1.5 lakh. The RGNIYD will contribute Rs.1.5 lakhs to the Youth Resource Centre.

The budget may be released in three instalments

In the 1st Instalment = 50% of total budget (Rs.75, 000/-) may be released

In the 2nd Instalment = 40% (Rs.60, 000/-) may be released after three months

In the 3rd Instalment = 10% (Rs.15, 000/-) may be released after evaluation by RGNIYD.
